DAY 1 Matthew 7v7

- To plant a family and children's community into St. Matthew's Community Centre.

- To further plant a children and families congregation into the St. Aidan's building on the relationships forged through the kitchen, and school engagement.

DAY 2 1 John 5:14

"This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us".

Dear Lord, We pray these exciting roles in our Communities of Hope will attract individuals who have been praying for a challenge to develop and lead a new programme of evolutionary and transformative community life.

The Project Leader and Volunteer Coordinator will have the responsibility of developing and managing the project, working closely with the leadership team to deliver church growth, challenge poverty and work with Children and Families (including Schools).

The Community worker/evangelist will develop and create new Christian communities. Initially being based within St Aidan's, you will train, support, and develop the missional focus of their aspirations in doing so you will, together with leadership team, respond to community pain, through challenging poverty in all its forms.

The Children and Families worker will develop, lead, and coordinate the children's work within the church & local community (including schools) through discerning and initiating new activities in partnership with the leadership team.

DAY 3 Ephesians 6v18

"And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people."



Pray the applicants for the Children and families worker can demonstrate both the ability to work with 8 primary schools (e.g. Ward Jackson, St Aidan's, Kingsley, Stranton, Eldon Grove, Throston, West Park, Jesmond Gardens) and the ability to bring the schools together within 6 months to celebrate a major festival (Christmas, Easter). Pray they will show a willingness to encourage families to share in a new worshipping community.

Lord, as Jesus said, "Suffer little children, and forbid them not, to come unto me: for of such is the kingdom of heaven". May applicants enthusiastically describe how they work with schools and encourage shared worship, may you guide them by your Holy Spirit in all they do. We pray school leaders respond to the call to be involved in a Community of Hope.

DAY 4 Hebrews 10:24-25

"And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love



and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

Pray an applicant for Project Leader and Volunteer Coordinator has the skills and experience in developing, managing and growing a Christian community. May they show creativity in ways to engage people to extend God's kingdom on earth. May they share God's love with their co-workers, volunteers and all communities with which they work. May their love for fellow man be apparent in their application to build Communities of Hope.

O Lord, we thank you for this wonderful gift of love which You have given us and which allows us to build a true communion of people ---provided we remain ever open to You, the source of all love. Help us to continue to love one other and accept one another unconditionally, as we grow our Communities of Hope together. Make us generous in giving and humble in receiving. Pray an applicant for Community worker/evangelist can show how they are able to respond to community pain, through challenging poverty in all its forms. May they be committed to social justice, supporting vulnerable and those on the fringes of society. As the homeless come for help may they show love, care and understanding and be prepared to listen to those who are disadvantaged by circumstances beyond their control. May they encourage the guests attending St Aidan's kitchen to share their experiences and come to know God.

Jesus, You know what it is like to be hungry and thirsty.

You know what it feels like to be a stranger who is made unwelcome.

You know the suffering of all who have lost everything.

We pray that by welcoming those hungry and in need we may show love for our neighbour and be closer to you.

DAY 6 Psalm 127:3

"Children are a heritage from the Lord, offspring a reward from him."

Pray the applicants for the Children and families worker and Community worker/evangelist are committed to church growth and are fuelled by the Holy Spirit to grow in love. May they be empowered to bring children and families to You and to create new worshipping communities in St Matthews Hall and St Aidan's.

Pray they are able to work effectively with groups offering activities for children' (including schools) and can encourage cooperative working so that children may be brought to Christ through experiencing festivals together. Pray they are able to listen and understand the problems faced by many families without judgement, fear or favour.

Lord God, we know you are in control of all things. We pray you will protect all children and families particularly within the Central Hartlepool Group. Keep them healthy and help them to thrive. Watch over them in every area of their lives, keep them safe and let their hearts be open to you. Amen.

DAY 7 Mark 16:15

We ask you Lord, though your grace, they choose with wisdom, discernment and integrity, valuing each candidate as unique individuals. We pray those chosen will be able to show how they will make a difference to church growth, challenging

poverty and to children and families involved in the Hartlepool Communities of Hope project.

The potency of prayer has subdued the strength of fire, it has bridled the rage of lions... extinguished wars, appeased the elements, expelled demons, burst the chains of death, expanded the gates of heaven, assuaged diseases... rescued cities from destruction... and arrested the progress of the thunderbolt.'

DAY 8 1 John 5:15

"And if we know that he hears us—whatever we ask—we know that we have what we asked of him."

As the closing date of 15th July approaches we pray those who requested more information have spoken with Mother Gemma and been enthused to pursue one or more of the posts advertised. "The Holy Spirit is up to something MIGHTY"! We ask those who have been praying for a challenging opportunity to serve God by working with children, families, vulnerable members of society and being passionate about social justice have been empowered by the Holy Spirit to apply for a position which will build our Communities of Hope. DAY 9 Matthew 5:16
